Today is LWML Sunday! This year we have a special guest preach, our own Rev. Bruce Jackson. Our Theme is "Ready to Serve," Luke 1:38 - And Mary said, "Behold, I am the servant of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word." And the angel departed from her. As redeemed children of God, Lutheran Women in Mission give thanks for the opportunity to serve others as we have been served, to proclaim that Jesus is our Lord and that He came for all nations, and the chance to respond with our mite offerings to support God's mission. Our example has been the widow and her mites. The offering she made was observed by our Lord leading Him to share that her

copper coins, her mites, were "everything — all she had to live on" (Mark 12:43). May our mite offerings be blessed for our Lord's kingdom. We thank God for the work and ministry of the Lutheran Women Missionary League.

Next week, we begin our three-week stewardship emphasis, "Living Wisely in an Unwise World". What makes the world unwise is that it rejects God. The world pursues wisdom, but, because it despises God, the wisdom of the world finds its roots in jealousy and selfish ambition. As God's people, we understand that all essential knowledge is found in God's Word. All truth is God's. God reveals His truth to us through His creation called general revelation (Romans 1:19-23), and in His Word called special revelation (1 Corinthians 2:6-11). We receive God's wisdom when we ask in faith for His wisdom (James 1:5). We acknowledge that true wisdom comes from God and that Jesus is the embodiment of that wisdom (1 Corinthians 1:30). To trust in Jesus and yield to His Holy Spirit is to walk in wisdom. We will spend the next three weeks focusing on what it means to live wisely in an unwise world.
