- P: Hosanna! Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Your friend and King—Jesus—has not forsaken you on account of your sin. Rather, your friend and King forgives you and welcomes you into his kingdom through faith. Friends, your hope and joy, your Savior and Lord, comes to you righteous and having salvation. By the promise and power of King Jesus, your sins are forgiven!

C: What a friend we have in Jesus!
