And finally, Jesus didn't look back. In fact, in Luke 9:62 Jesus says it pointedly: "No man, having put his hand to the plow, and looking back, is fit for the kingdom of God." Jesus knew there was no turning back. The threats of public humiliation, imprisonment and even death on the cross did not dissuade him. He had committed himself to God's plan for his life. He would see it through. That was His resolution.

There are very few dreams that are achieved without sacrifice. There are many of you who have discovered that in your own lives. The sleepless hours, the unending stress, the self-doubts and near failures. How can we expect to achieve our worldly dreams without sacrifice and expect to give less in serving Christ? This is a new year (2025), a new beginning. Let's begin this New Year with a sense of humility and urgency and a commitment to give our very best to whatever and however God has called us to serve Him. 



2024 Elders' Report

Redeemer Lutheran Church continues to be faithful in Word, sacrament, and doctrine, while joining Christians around the world in following the command that our Lord and Savior gave us in the Great Commission. We continue to emphasize the importance of Christian education and instruction, from toddlers through our most mature adults, with our Sunday School, mid-week, and Bible Study programs. We are blessed with so many faithful members who love to serve our Lord utilizing the gifts and abilities given to them!

The elders held several different initiatives this past year in an attempt to encourage spiritual growth of our members, as well as better member engagement and attendance at our worship services. During the Lenten season we conducted an all-member outreach event where we made our best attempt to touch base with <u>all</u> members, to converse with them to get to know them better, and to remind them of the wonderful services that were being offered at Redeemer during Lent and Easter. This was also an attempt to reach out to our inactive members to encourage them to come and join us. We continue to find it very seldom that we hear back from many of our inactive members after leaving messages of several forms with them.

In the late summer we held a social picnic/potluck at the Bruce and Roberta Timmons' residence. We enjoyed fellowship with all elders, staff, and their families who could make it. Prior to the busy fall season we also held a social reception at church where we invited all of our newer members to join staff and elders for a fun reception and a chance to be introduced and better acquainted with each other.

During our stewardship campaign in October, we hosted a prayer vigil. We had a very nice setting and a wonderful prayer booklet put together by our pastors and staff, with prayer requests submitted by members included for attendees to use in their prayer time. Unfortunately this event was very lightly attended. I pray that we as members strongly consider attending our future prayer vigils. We only need to look upon the ministry of our Lord and His disciples to know how important prayer is for our spiritual growth and strength. On December 9 we teamed up with Thrivent Choice here at Redeemer to participate in a soup supper/fellowship event, and then went out to do some Christmas caroling to several of our members' homes especially those who are mostly home-bound. This event was a huge success and we will plan on making it an annual event!

Our attendance for a normal worship service has been approximately 22-25% of our overall membership. This has been very steady on a percentage basis the past several years. Many congregations throughout our district and synod are seeing a significant drop in their membership and attendance numbers. Several are even making the difficult decision to close their doors.

The demographics of our congregation continues to show a trend of an increasing number of members who are of the older generation. Many of these individuals are also living in care facilities, or are not able to leave their home very easily. I foresee our staff and congregation spending more time in ministry and care toward these individuals in the years ahead.

I encourage each of us to take some time in personal reflection and prayer and consider the following in regard to each of our own spiritual habits and stewardship:

- -May we be a constant witness for the Gospel message
- -Let us make an effort to be consistent in Word, prayer, and worship
- -Let us be consistent in prayer for our pastors and staff
- -May we as a body of Christ be diligent and obedient in our service, in the giving of our time, talents, and treasure
- -May we be supportive of our missionaries and all mission based projects we support
- -May we reach out to our neighbor in need
- -May we be encouraging to our members who are not consistent in their worship attendance
- -May we be eager to invite others to church
- -May we be welcoming to visitors and our newer members, making an effort to introduce ourselves and to get to know them
- -Let us make an attempt to greet and have fellowship with members who attend a different worship service than we normally do

~ Apple and Spice Cookies ~



So, it's a new year! Maybe you've made a list of what you want to do or what you want to stop this year? How about trying a new cookie? Here is a tasty little recipe that I found from Kellogg's cereal box. It looks yummy.

Ingredients:

3 c. Kellogg's® Rice Krispies® cereal

2 I/2 c. all-purpose flour

I tsp baking soda

1/4 tsp salt

I tsp ginger

I tsp cinnamon

1/2 tsp cloves

I 1/4 c. firmly packed brown sugar

I/4 c. margarine / butter, softened

1/4 c. unsweetened applesauce

1/4 c. molasses

2 egg whites

1/4 c. granulated sugar

Directions:

- 1. Stir together Kellogg's® Rice Krispies® cereal, flour, soda, salt and spices. Set aside.
- 2. In large electric mixer bowl, beat together brown sugar and margarine on medium speed until thoroughly combined. Add applesauce, molasses and egg whites, mixing until smooth. Add cereal mixture, mixing until combined. Drop by level tablespoon into granulated sugar and roll to coat.

Place on baking sheets coated with cooking spray. Press with bottom of measuring cup dipped in sugar to 2


Nancy Eckert resigned from her treasurer position. Question about outsourcing work of treasurer. Discussion held. Council members and pastors will continue to search for a treasurer.


